

Headline- a heading at the top of an article or page in a newspaper or magazine; written in fragments and omit articles like a, an, and the

Sub-headline (optional)- the headline that is below the main one, usually composed of a few more words and expanding upon what the main headline is trying to say

Byline- a line in a newspaper naming the writer of an article

Lead- The lead, or opening paragraph, is the most important part of a news story

Article body- The article body is the full text of the article
