Animal Farm- Identifying Authority in Chapter 6

*This is an **individual** activity during which you will think about the idea of authority and its portrayal in *Animal Farm*.*

1. Thinking about your own experience, define the term “authority.”
2. What does “authority” mean, and what does it look like?
3. What different types of authority (think of authority figures) are found in your everyday life? These can be **formal authority** (someone assigned a role, like **principal** or **team captain**) or **informal authority** (someone who assumes a role without a title, like a **class leader** or **team spokesperson**).
