"Hamlet" Newscast Project

Reflecting on the first 3 scenes of "Hamlet," pick one event or happening that stands out as newsworthy for the audience. Choose a scene that has a lot of importance to the overall plot of the play. Make sure to select a scene that includes more than one character. Then, with your group, create a breaking newscast interviewing a character or two from the scene.

- Make sure to include important events in the sequence that would deal with the breaking news of the scene
- Identify pertinent quotes to the scene so that the audience may help to tell the story
- Any **appropriate** props will provide extra credit for the scene
- Make sure to include the emotions of the characters that help to tell the scene

Emotions displayed in the scene:

- Use key words for breaking news coverage, like "This just in!" and "First hand evidence from an eye witness..."

- Cite the Scene and line #s below to help organize your newscast
